Parents are encouraged to take concerns first to the teacher then to administration if necessary. Andrea Reid is the rep for a group called Parents Matter. This is an avenue for CESD to hear from parents. Some highlights from the last meeting include increasing avenues for communication to the school, bussing, volunteer opportunities, improving trust between the board, teachers, and parents. One common concern

across the division is trustee representation and communication back to council. Andrea will continue attending these meetings.
