The first month of the second semester seems to have whizzed by! Our high school students are well into their courses and the elementary and middle school are already getting their next round of report cards on March 16! We hope you carefully review your child's progress and achievement with them frequently.

Please come in to meet with your child's teacher(s) on March 19th. You can phone in to the school to book your interviews beginning March 9th. While our school division has moved away from paper report cards for high school, and soon middle school, we encourage parents/guardians to utilize PowerSchool, Google Classroom and the Cremona School website to access current grades, upcoming exams and assignments, class material and missing assignments.

Two of the biggest predictors in a child's success at school are parental involvement and attendance. When we are all on the same team, we can encourage our students to become accountable and involved in their education. No matter the age or grade of a student, both teachers and parents need to facilitate conversations about positive work habits and attendance that will lead to not only academic achievement, but valuable life skills as well. Reinforce the importance of regularly completing and submitting assignments on time. Students who establish this habit early on tend to score better on formal assessments as they are generally more prepared and aware of their strengths and weaknesses. Help your children to appreciate the value of punctuality and effort in the school environment. Assist your children in setting and monitoring academic goals.

At Cremona School, we want all our students to reach for the stars and graduate with a strong work ethic and commitment to excellence.

With March here, and continuously changing weather, please send your children dressed for all weather. Layers are a great choice. Having extra clothes at school for the younger as with the snow we are bound to have many puddles.

March is survey month. The school division puts out an annual survey to each school. Some of the questions come from our division and some come directly from us. We really appreciate your input and would ask you to please stop and fill out the survey at Parent/ Teacher interview night on March 19th. We would also invite you to come join us and have a look through the displays in the gym for Discovery Night as well as come into our library for our book fair.

Students are achieving high levels of success in Chinook's Edge

A Message from the Superintendent

This month's newsletter theme of 'Assessment' provides a perfect opportunity to share our pride for the great accomplishments of our students and staff.

The work underway in schools across Chinook's Edge is continuing to create an upward trend in several measures. For instance, we are pleased with the high number of students who are achieving the acceptable standard on both Provincial Achievement Tests and Diploma Exams – which are 3.5% and 4.3% above provincial average respectively. We are also seeing increasing levels of excellence across our division and we know our focused priority on academic rigour is resulting in student achievement and success.

In Chinook's Edge, we measure student success in a number of other important ways, as well. For instance, upwards of 90% of our students continually assure us through survey data that they feel safe at school, which is a measure we highly value.

Eighty-four percent of our students are reading at grade level, which is an increase of 6% from three years ago. As well, 81.5% of our students complete high school which is above the provincial average of 79%. These are some of the other important indications that our focused work is impacting students at every grade level. Our four division-wide goals are leading to success for our students – and for everyone who works alongside them each day in our school communities.







School Attendance is CRITICAL!!

CESD has a goal that all students attend school 90% of the time.

Please consider the following:

-Missing 10% of school days very negatively affects academic achievement.

-Missing 1 day/week is approximately 22% of the CESD school year.

-Missing 1 day/week equals approximately 7.8 weeks of the school year.

-Missing 1 day/week each year from grades 8-12 adds up to a full year of school absences.

Also, Grades 9-12 typically have 80 minute classes daily in their core courses.

There is no way to replace the missed teaching and learning that happens on any school day. Parents can make a huge difference in this area by what they allow and encourage. (Visit attendanceworks.org for research and links on attendance.)




