Hello everyone, it is my honour to be starting the new role as Academic Advisor here at Cremona School. I am excited to start working with your child(ren) regarding their career and post-secondary plans. At the beginning of the semester, I will be distributing a package to every Grade 12 student that will include their current credits, scholarships and how to apply for them, and some general information on student loans and how to apply to post-secondary. Please know that sometimes students need some parental "pushing" when it comes to applying for scholarships.

I will be having one lengthy meeting with every Grade 12 student before Christmas and encourage them to come back and see me ANY TIME they have more questions or concerns. Students considering going to a college are my first priority as diploma programs are very competitive and have early application deadlines. If parents wish to be a part of this discussion, just contact me and I will arrange a convenient time for all of us to meet. I will meet with the Grade 11s later in the second semester.

I would also encourage students and parents to research when the post-secondaries are hosting an OPEN HOUSE. These are important to attend as they gog over general information about the programs and admissions and waive application fees. I will do my best to connect with their choices of post-secondaries and arrange for presentations. I'm also hoping to take them to Mt Royal University and SAIT in the Fall.

FAMILY SCHOOL WELLNESS PROGRAM

The Family School Wellness Team is here to support students through anything that impacts student learning. By working as a team we are able to increase our ability to better serve the community of Cremona School.

The Family School Wellness Program is a confidential, voluntary, preventative service offered to children, youth and families. It is available to all children aged three to eighteen and their families. Family School Wellness is available from September to June and is free of charge.

Any Cremona School student or family requiring family related support or information can access the program. Students, parents, teachers, and school staff can make referrals.

The role as a Family School Wellness Worker is to:

- Provide support services to families and children facing social, emotional or family challenges
- Promote effective communication and parenting skills
- Offer short-term individual or family support
- Build skills with students

- Assist in finding information and resources such as counseling, after-hours crisis response workers, or legal advice
- Advocate within the school or community at large
- Promote preventative opportunities within the school and community
- Collaborate with community agencies

Some reasons to refer would include, Anger Management, Peer Social Support, Anxiety, Depression, Grief/loss, SIbling Conflict, Bullying/Being Bullied, Self Esteem, Domestic Violence, Sexuality, Pregnancy, School Attendance, Mental Health, Self-Regulation.
