  Questions around field trips:

Question about the potential to split up the swimming/skiing for less of a financial hit on families all at once. Joanna explained why we are slated into swimming time and Skiing has a short window. Have looked at other swim locations in the past (Sundre is not a great option as they don't make up missed lessons, whereas Didsbury does. Cochrane is more costly). Cremona students still get to go swimming even if fees have been paid up front. Request from council to have more notice than two weeks of up-coming field trip costs. Joanna said to count on swimming to be at the same time next year.

Is there a way to have an estimated cost laid out at the beginning of the year? Potentially. Council member requested to have more transparency with "Option fees" early in the school year.

Is Calaway park an option for year end? - logistically difficult to manage all children and busing, difficult to get a date.

Are there options for \$ support for those students who would like to go on mandatory field trips but may not have the \$ access? - funds from school fundraising are available for students except (Grade 6 and up ski trips) as these are not mandatory. If parents need help with funds contact the teacher or they are welcome to contact the office.

## 8. CSES - Cremona School Enhancement Society - reported by Faisal

CSES is a registered charity having funded many things for the school. They are currently raising \$ for a playground, and discount swimming. Teachers can request money from CSES to cover some fees like cosmo for example to help pass the savings on to families.

### 11. New Business

- a. Math Fair report by Suanne Kempster
- House colors reading buddy blitz monthly challenge through k-12 went really well in November. This idea of the math fair is to now highlight numeracy skills. Primary focus is to connect k-12 to celebrate numeracy through a variety of activities. Suzanne shared some ideas of what this may look like.
- Math gallery (student work, )Display of math posters are examples of of school focused ideas, More peripheral ideas include raffles, math story corner, contests, stations of games for families, math challenges, baking stand, professions booths

At the minimum we will do an afternoon with student color groups and hopefully incorporate evening activities. This work requires support from parents and council and likely some funds to expand on these ideas.

Potential to run as an AGM and showcase what the council does.

Feedback - where - use the school widely (except classrooms)

- -offer food?
- -how math is related to your profession booths (engineering, mechanicing, farming, firemen, vet)
- -punch card idea for visiting a certain number of booths and get a reward
- -leadership can help encourage high school kids to show up
- -sponsorship ideas mountain view county for grab bag items.

- -logistically would have to have a small break in time from afternoon to allow for bussing then return for evening activities.
- **-Julia L. motions** that we spend money on food up to 700\$ for an evening event. Stacey Seconded.
- -communication will be shared through the council in order to set up planning meetings.
- -promotional ideas needed too

Dates are narrowed down to May 24 (primary option) and May 31 as possibilities.

b. RAWG (Resource allocation working group) Work will be done next Tuesday to plan for teacher allocation across the entire division for next year. Re-evaluation happens at the end of September. After Sept 30 funding does not get allocated to the school with any new admissions.

Now have a way of mathematically seeing how many teachers are required per kid. So teachers are assigned in a strategic way.

c. School Supplies

Will be getting local supplies through Carstairs, (not school start) went with more local option. Teachers are asked what they want and teachers need to request by the end of March what goes on the list for next year. Council commented that It would be nice for lists to include the basis of what is needed to start.
