# Yearly Reminder to Check PowerSchool Parent Portal Account to sign in...

Cremona School staff are planning ahead for the upcoming year.

In mid-August, Chinook's Edge will be sending home your "Annual Re-Enrollment and Consents" for the 2025-2026 School year. The form will need to be completed and submitted prior to the start of the school year.

The form will ensure your registration, up-to-date information and certain consents for the upcoming school year.

The form contains a Walking field trip, and Technology consents that has to be completed every year before your child can participate in these activities.

We are asking parents and guardians to ensure that they can sign into their PowerSchool parent portal account before the end of the year. If you are having troubles with your username or password, please contact your school before the end of the school year to get help!

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
